USC SHOAH FOUNDATION – THE INSTITUTE FOR VISUAL HISTORY AND EDUCATION

USC Shoah Foundation owns the intellectual property rights, including copyrights, to the Visual History Archive and its contents. All rights are reserved by the USC Shoah Foundation. The Visual History Archive is a web-based software application located at <http://vha.usc.edu> that provides searchable access to the USC Shoah Foundation videotaped interviews (“Interviews”), cataloguing and indexing data, and any portions thereof.

Rights Granted to Use the Visual History Archive and Its Contents

As an authorized User of Universität Wien, USC Shoah Foundation grants you permission to access and view the Visual History Archive and its contents.

USC Shoah Foundation also grants you a royalty free, non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use Interviews or portions thereof subject to the provisions below:

- You may use the Interviews or portions thereof accessed through the Visual History Archive for the purposes of research and teaching.
- Publication of testimonies in whole or in part beyond reasonable quotations in scholarly work requires a separate license from the USC Shoah Foundation.
- You may create derivative materials for teaching purposes and those products may be disseminated only as part of courses offered by or on behalf of Universität Wien. You may post such materials via the Internet for the duration of the course as long as those materials are removed at the end of the course.

All other derivative products require a separate and specific license from the USC SF.

Publication of transcripts in whole or in part beyond reasonable quotations in scholarly work requires a separate license.

A copyright notice must appear on any testimony or segment thereof used in research or teaching product. The copyright notice shall state: © [insert year] USC Shoah Foundation.

USC Shoah Foundation’s recommended citation standard for scholarly works follows the MLA guidelines (7thed.) for web-based non-periodical publications:

Interviewee’s name, the word Interview and the number of the interview code, the title of the website (italicized), the publisher, the date of publication, the medium (Web), and the date of access.

In the event of a breach of the *Terms of Use*, the USC Shoah Foundation must be promptly notified. Failure to comply with the *Terms of Use* may subject violators to penalties for copyright infringement.
